





Brotherhood Ride ~ will be dedicated to Florida's Fallen Heroes who died in the line of duty in 2020 while protecting their communities. We will also be riding for the 20th Anniversary of 9/11 and honor the first responders who have died from 9/11 related illnesses.

On August 20th, our team will pedal from Naples, FL to New York City for 23 days, covering over 1,700 miles and average 70-100 miles a day.

Erick Robertson of "9/11 Remembered ~ The Traveling Memorial" stayed with us in July while making his rounds throughout the state of Florida visiting pieces of the World Trade Center that were donated to organizations that established their own 9/11 Memorials.

Exalted Ruler Jim McCleary, his wife Lara, and PER Dennis Roberts had the pleasure of talking with Erick and getting a tour of the RV picturec below. The rig has a podcast studio named in honor of Todd Beamer of Flight 93. As Erick travels across the country, he has guests that discuss everything under the sun, especially topics regarding September 11, 2001, and the impact this important mark on history has had and continues to have on humanity worldwide to this day. The organization's motto is "9/11 didn't end in 2001!" Jim presented a coin to Erick that he received for his service during Operation Safe Skies, a continuing mission to secure the Capitol region to ensure another attack through the air on our Capitol never happens again. This coin will join many others as part of a "coin wall" that will become a part of the rolling 9/11 Memorial.

Erick's next stop is to the Florida Keys to dive on the USS Vandenberg for a special dedication.

Their mission is to travel across the country to specifically share the history of 9/11 with cities across America that have established their own memorials. 9/11 Remembered will be visiting all these memorials to not only honor them but to also continue their legacy that we **NEVER FORGET** the day that changed the world forever.


