### **April 2019 Teenager of the Month Sydney Rintoul**



Sydney Rintoul is an outstanding senior at Newsome High School where she excels academically, athletically, and in her service to the community. She is a well-rounded young lady ready for any future challenge.

Academically, she has a GPA: 7.386/3.986 (unweighted) and out of her senior class size of 679, she is ranked as 8th, (Top 2%). She has been awarded to the Principal's Honor Roll (all four quarters): Grades 9, 10, 11 and as a College Board AP Scholar for her 10th and 11th years. She is a member of the following honor societies: National Honor Society; Spanish Honor Society; Science Honor Society; and Social Studies Honor Society (Rho Kappa). Her involvement in Student Government is noteworthy. She has served as: Executive Board Member, where she helped created and implemented the inaugural homecoming parade; as chairperson of homecoming parade; implemented school-wide program on dangers of texting and driving with outside speaker Chairperson of Homecoming parade at school and dance at Raymond James Stadium for over 2,500 students; manage contacts and logistics for all SGA programs including outside speakers; responsible for twelve t-shirt designs for SGA programs and events throughout the year.

She is the co-founder of the Wolf Nation Club; a school spirit club where 85 members focused on expanding school spirit across all sports by increasing attendance and providing halftime entertainment at sporting events; collaborated with the athletic boosters club to set and achieve goals.

Athletically, Sydney is an outstanding player on the Newsome Varsity Lacrosse Team, where she is an anchor starter on Defense, being named the "Newsome Defensive Player of the Year" for her sophomore and junior years and has been named Team Captain and earned her Varsity Letter. The Lacrosse team has won the District Championship during her first three years on the team, and the team has advanced to State Elite 8 and Sweet 16. The team was selected 1st Team All County Western Conference and selected as US Lacrosse Academic All-American: 11 (top 1 % in country). Her leadership helped foster a winning tradition.

She was also selected as Positive Coaching Alliance School Representative, where she attended monthly seminars on various topics like leadership, social media awareness and sportsmanship representing Newsome through this organization; she learned skills to improve herself as an athlete, teammate and leader.
